6.5 Treasurer/Registrar Report- Lindsay Phillips

-Current status is 103 active members, 8 Inactive, 7 students and 1 Life Member in NS for a total of 119. PEI 7 active members and no inactive members.

-Dues breakdown-NS \$280, \$65 to CSCT, \$160 to Legal fund leaving \$55 for CTANS

-PEI \$120, \$65 to CSCT and \$55 to CTANS (don't pay into legal fund, when we become legislated, they will have to leave CTANS

-Inactive \$80, \$55 to CSCT and \$25 to CTANS

-In the bank as of Friday April 29, 2022, \$38,703.25 in operating account, \$134,731.95 in legal account (will change a little bit), \$9276.75 in GIC

-Review of expenses

-What is an inactive member? Not working in the field, can attend AGM but can not vote, no penalty and can be indefinitely if you keep in good standing (CEUs, dues, etc)

6.6 CEU/Education Report-Jaye MacMullin

-Last year of Triennium, Year goes from Jan 1 to Dec 31 suggested to get 10 CEUs/yr, both active and inactive need CEUs
