Registrar & Treasurer Report

Happy Fall CTANS members,

Registration is open for the 2023 year. All members must log into the CTANS website confirm their address for registration. This will need to be done yearly. If you are payroll deduction and have confirmed your demographics, your part is complete. If you are unsure if you have payroll deduction, please check your paystub, or contact your hospitals payroll/admin office. I do not know this information until I receive cheques from the employer.

Payments, as always, can be made via, PayPal, or credit card via the website. You may also pay via cheque if you prefer. Send me an email and I can provide you with an address. **Cash will no longer be accepted.** If you do not have a credit card you can pick up a prepaid credit card at any store that sells gift cards. i.e., Shoppers Drug Mart, Sobeys, Superstore.

Late submissions are subject to a \$100 late fee. This will be added automatically through the website after Oct. 31, 2022. As always if you have extenuating circumstances, please email the registrar and we can give you an extension. An extension will only be granted to members who have contacted me prior to Oct. 31, 2022, and not after.

When your registration is complete you should receive an email notifying you the registration has been updated. I will also update FB once registration is completed. Cards with the new year will not be available until Jan 1, 2023.



REMINDER your dues are paid for the upcoming year not the year you pay. CTANS payments are due October 31 annually. Cards and receipts can now be printed on the new website. Membership Types & Requirements

Registered Active Member in Good Standing - a Registered Member who holds a valid certificate of successful completion of the CSCT's certification examination and who has satisfied all prerequisites established by the Board, including but not limited to full payment of all applicable membership dues and/or collection of mandatory CEUs. A Registered active Member in Good Standing has the right to vote at a meeting of the Members, may be elected to the board and may be appointed to an office of the Society.

Registered Inactive Member in good standing- A Registered member who has paid all applicable membership dues and submitted the mandatory thirty (30) CEUs but who has self-declared that he/she is not actively working in the field. Inactive Members do not have the right to vote or be appointed to an office of the Society.

Member Not in Good Standing - a member who has not satisfied all prerequisites established by the Board, including but not limited to full payment of all applicable membership dues and/or collection of mandatory CEUs. A Registered Member Not in Good Standing has no right to attend the CTANS annual general meeting.

Continuing Education Units

Hello Folks!

I hope all is well with everyone as we enter into the final 3 months of the 2020-2022 CSCT Triennium. I know a lot you have gotten your 30 CEUs, which is fantastic! Great work, all of you! However, I know there are a few of you who still need to collect a few more. Do not panic! There is still time! Highlighted below are some ways you can obtain some last minute CEUs (Based on the CSCT Guidelines).

Internet Studies

- includes: any cardiac related articles/readings, videos, and television programs watched or read online. (i.e.: The Canadian Cardiovascular Society website https://ccs.ca/recorded-events/ and acadoodle.com for videos and learnings.
- 1 CEU per each "Internet Study" cited.
- 1 CEU extra for including a brief summary of each "Internet Study" you read / watch.

Max 8 submissions per year.

Conferences and Seminars

- Watching previously recorded conferences
 - CCC and Other Cardiac Conferences
 - 1 CEU per 30 min video (of a conference)
 - 1 Bonus CEU for each brief summary write up

Max: 5 per day

Cardiology Rounds

- 1 CEU per attened (in person or online)
 - o Include topic, speaker and date
 - o 1 Bonus CEU per each brief summary write of Cardiology Rounds attended.

Max. 5 per year



Research Projects

- 5 CEUs per Paper or Project (project could be a bristol board type of display as well)
- 1 bonus CEU for presenting (or displaying project)
 - Choose topic (i.e., Brugada)
 - Present to small group or individual Or Video it! Submit with a copy of the write up.

No maximum noted on Guidelines, so do as many as you like.

CSCT Case Studies

- CSCT Website 1 CEU per case study read & amp; cited.
- 1 Bonus CEU for each brief summary write up
- No Maximum noted on Guidelines

Additional Ways:

- Preceptor (1 CEU per 7.5 hours with student)
 - Stenberg, BCIT, EHS, RT... etc
 - Max 5 per year
- CPR Certification
 - 1 per hour attended
 - Max 5 per year
- Provincial AGMs (CTANS AGM)
 - 5 CEUs per day attended
 - Additional 5 CEUs for Hosting AGM
 - Additional 5 CEUs if you do a presentation

I hope this is helpful for any Techs still working at achieving their CEUs. Please feel free to contact me for further explanation or clarification on any of these suggestions I've given. Please remember, and this is for EVERYONE,

- 1) Keep a copy of all your CEU submissions (either on paper or on a computer),
- 2) Cite all your resources and provide all relevant proof of your CEUs,
- 3) Remember all Maximum Limits are absolute and CEUs cannot be carried over to the next Triennium
- 4) FINAL SUBMISSION DATE IS DECEMBER 31, 2022. Late submissions will not qualify.

Pumpkin Pie Recipe MADE SIMPLE AND EASY

PREP: 10 MINS | COOK: 50 MINS | TOTAL: 1 HR | SERVINGS: 8

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (15 ounces) can pumpkin puree
- 1 (14 ounces) Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 2 large eggs

- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 (9 inch) unbaked pie crust




DIRECTIONS

Mix - Well, technically you'll first need to preheat the oven at 425 degrees F (220 degrees C). Then you can start by mixing all the ingredients for your filling: pumpkin puree, sweetened condensed milk, eggs, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, and salt. Whisk it all together until smooth.

Bake - Pour mixture into pie crust (store-bought or homemade is fine). Bake in the oven for 15 mins.


Reduce Heat and Bake Some More - Now you'll reduce the heat to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) and continue to bake for 35 to 40 minutes. To help to cook evenly without cracking. Once a knife inserted 1 inch from the crust comes out clean, then it's ready. The center should be just a little jiggly. Let cool & serve, refrigerate, or freeze. Really, that's it!
